About this qualification

This qualification provides an ideal taster for learners who may be new to the sector or new to the world of work. It is accessible to learners aged 16 years plus including school leavers who are eligible for employment and pre-apprenticeship programmes, adult returners or those undergoing a career change and who may want to understand more about working in health and social care.

It aims to introduce some basic concepts of caring and preparation for employment in the sector. It provides progression to the Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England.

Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification but learners will need to be at least 16 years of age.

Experience in the workplace

Learners do not need to be working or attend work placements to complete this qualification as it is knowledge only.

Qualification structure

To achieve the qualification learners will need to complete all 9 mandatory units with a total credit value of 21.
